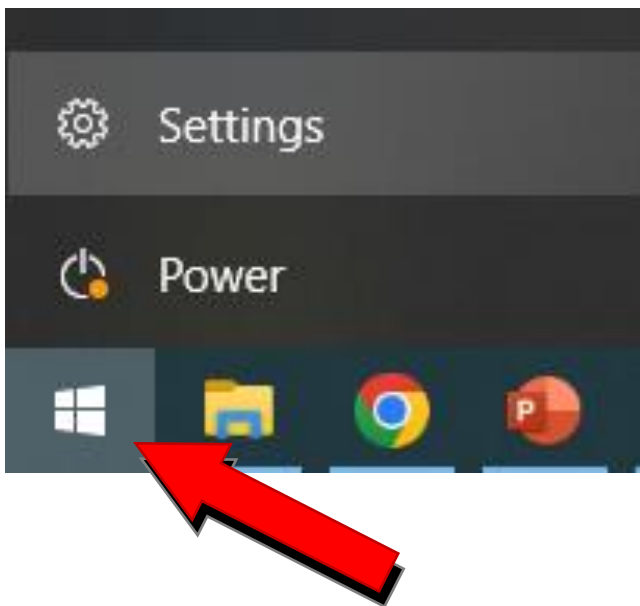
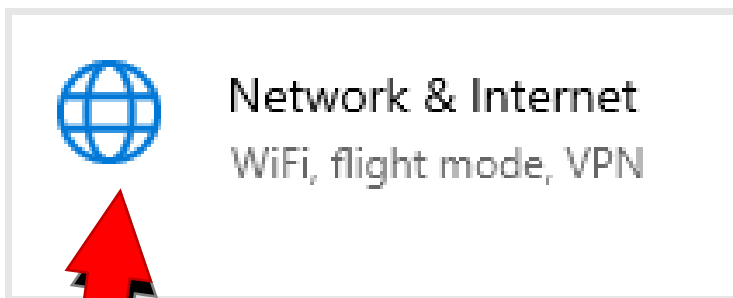




# Connecting to the Internet on Desktop



To connect to the internet at home, start clicking the **Windows** icon on the bottom left of your screen, and then select **Settings**, which looks like a **gear**.



Locate the option that says **Network & Internet**, with a **globe icon** next to it.



Then, on the left of the screen, click on **WiFi** to bring up the connection menu.

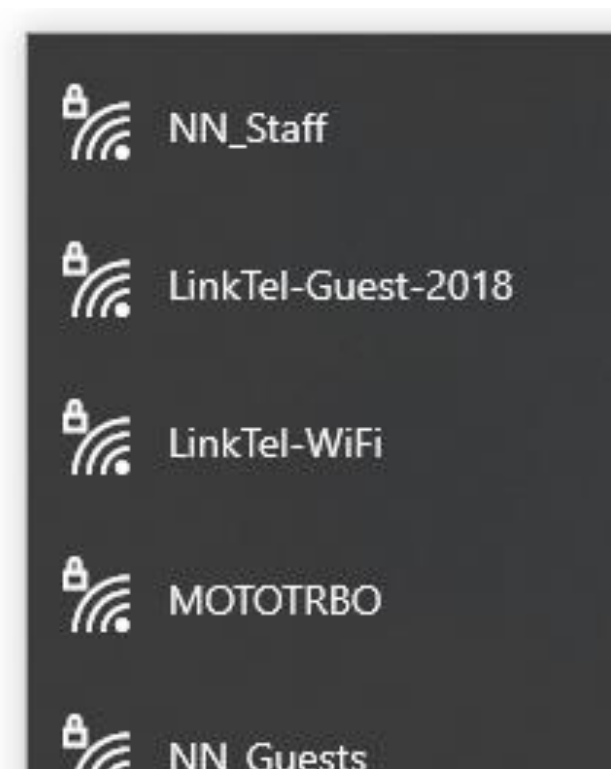

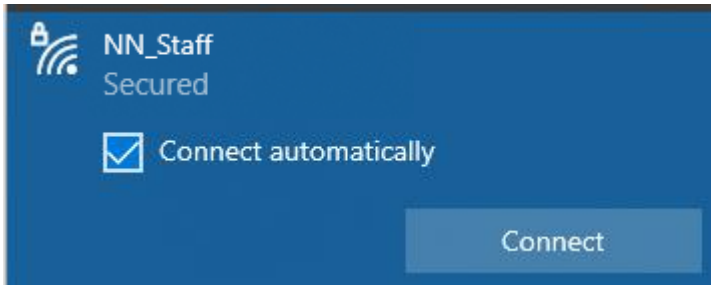

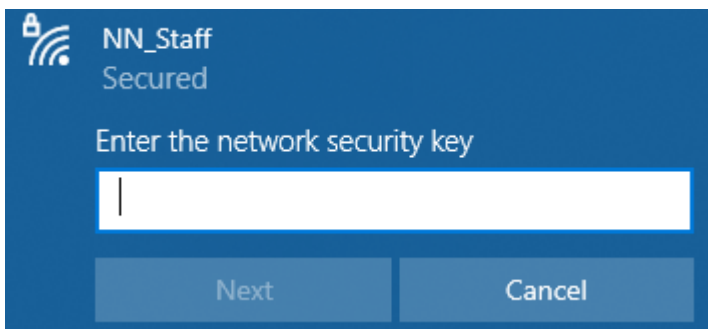
At the top of the screen, make sure the toggle is switched to **on**, it will appear **blue**. Then click the first option underneath it, which says **Show available networks**.



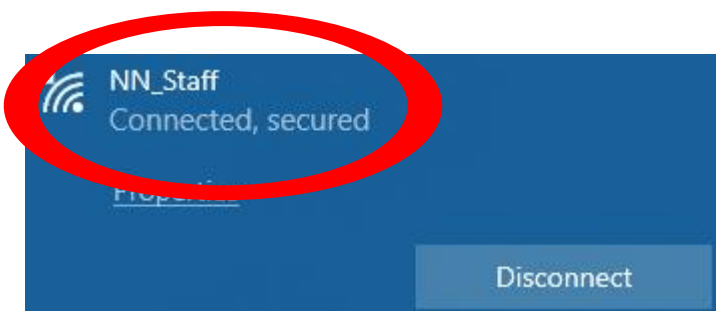
You will see a list of networks you can connect to in the bottom right of your screen. Check the **back, sides, and underside of your router** to find the network name and password, or ask someone who knows.



Click on the name that **matches the name of your network**. Make sure the **Connect automatically** option is checked if this is your own network. Your device will connect automatically in future.



Then, type in the password from your router into the box provided, and click **Next**.



Check that the network says **“Connected, Secured”**. If it does, you are good to go.
